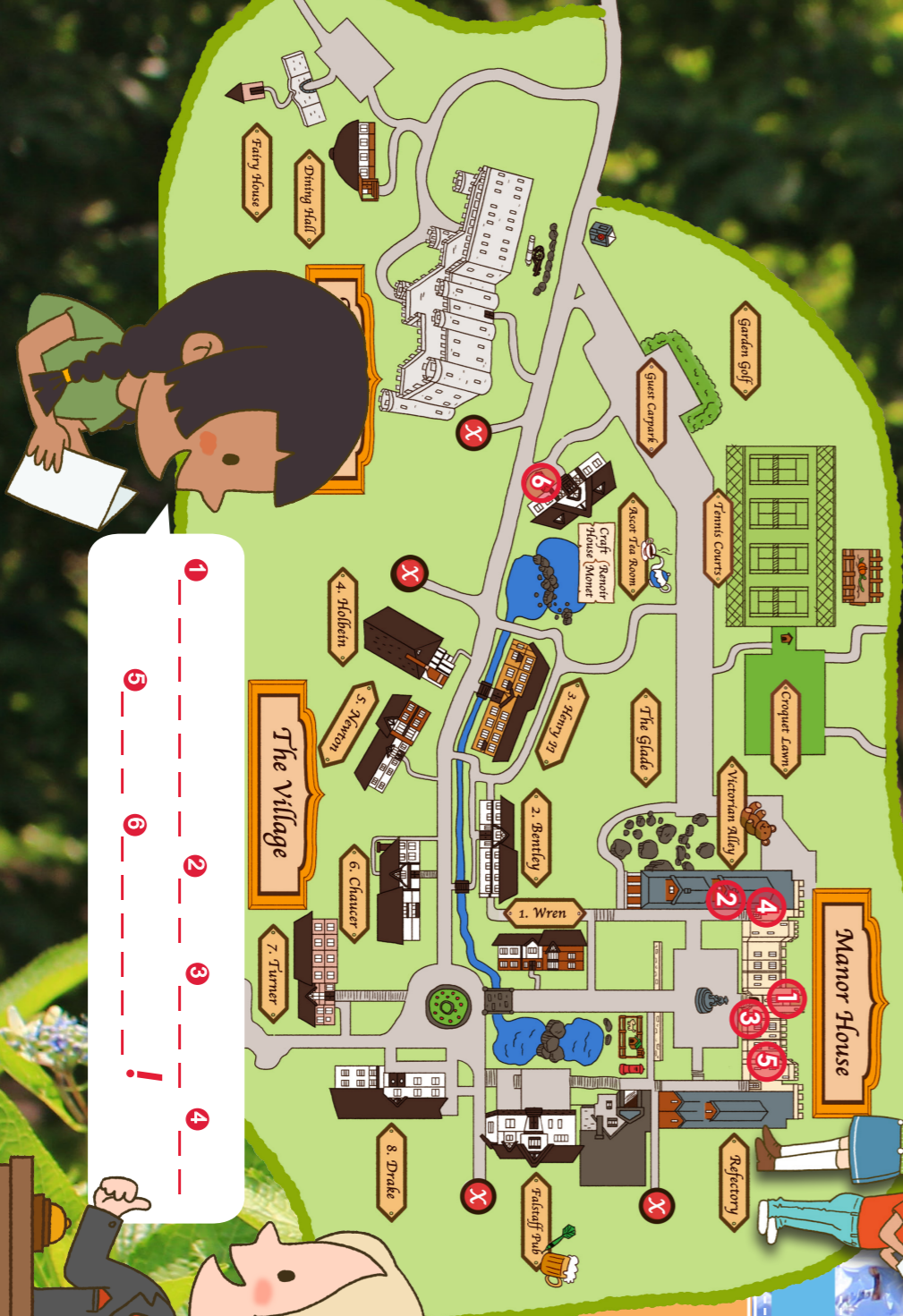

Munro Bagging



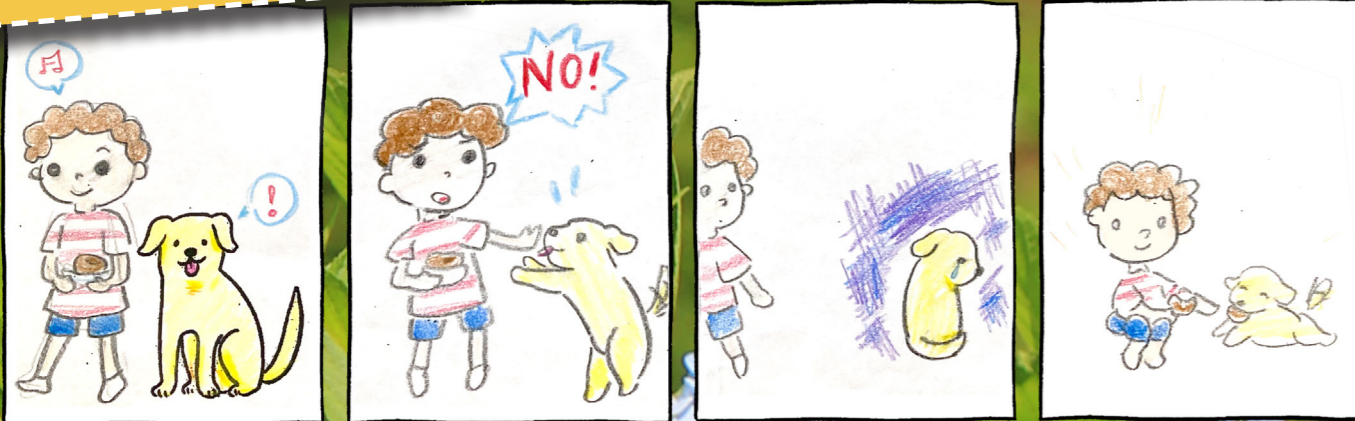

In 1891 Sir Hugh Munro documented all of Scotland's mountains over 3000 ft. That's why these mountains are called "Munros". To 'bag' a Munro means to climb to the top.

Summer is the most popular time because the weather is usually better. It's still important to bring proper equipment such as waterproof clothing, a map, a compass, and food and water in a rucksack as the weather in Scotland is notorious for changing quickly.
