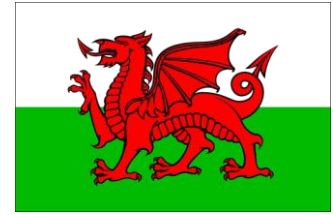

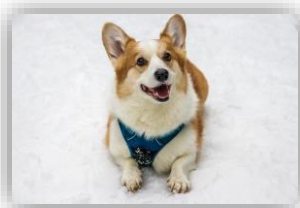
### The Castles of Wales
